

Exemption from the written portion of the language proficiency test

Requirements:

- successful participation in the final examination of one of the courses offered by the University of Bamberg's Language Centre from the list below;
- the following three skills have already been tested in the final examination of the course attended: **writing, reading comprehension, listening comprehension**;
- the final mark of the examination taken is **2.0 or higher**;
- the examination was taken **not more than one year before** the date of the application to study abroad

Application for exemption from the written portion of the test:

- Completion of the **electronic application form**. This form is made accessible on the Language Centre's homepage from **mid-September to mid-October** and from **mid-June to mid-July**.
- After successful submission of the application form, you will first receive an **automatic confirmation of receipt**.
- You will **receive final confirmation of exemption from the written part of the test and information on the oral examination date** by email to your stud.uni-bamberg account no later than one week after the application form has been closed.
In this case, registration via Flexnow is not necessary!
- If you are notified that your request for exemption from the written part of the test cannot be granted for certain reasons, you will have sufficient time to register for one of the written test dates via Flexnow.
